AIM

- Address the discrimination and marginalisation that Indigenous youth face in Vancouver
- Create employment opportunities for Indigenous youth in mainstream settings (community centres)
- Make mainstream community services more inclusive

IMPLEMENTATION

Indigenous youth receive training as community leaders, in order to work with RISE partner organisations in local community centers where they support Indigenous residents and other excluded members of the community.

SUCCESSES

- Most RISE leaders
 have continuous
 employment in the
 public sector
 More awareness of
- More awareness of the needs of Indigenous youth and populations
- More and more partners and supporters are joining the collective

CHALLENGES

- Many positions in community centres are precarious
- It can be hard to address hidden and embedded racism

KEY LEARNINGS

- Need for ongoing dialogue and bringing new partners on board
- Importance of finding champions in position of influence
- Make sure the model and vision are rooted in community and based on community needs
